Bylaws Revisions Adopted By Delta Mu Delta

Bylaws changes approved by the chapters now recognize the relationship between the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP) and Delta Mu Delta (DMD). In the future, only those schools accredited by ACBSP may establish DMD chapters. Current chapters not accredited by the ACBSP or any other specialized business accrediting body remain DMD chapters in good standing. Since 1991, ACBSP has accredited 35 schools, 65% of which have a DMD chapter or are in the process of establishing one.

The Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs is an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Office of Education, the only federal body that recognizes accrediting organizations. The linkage between Delta Mu Delta and ACBSP will enhance the society's image as well as add value to individual membership, according to A.J. Foranoco, president of the National Chapter.

An additional revision mandates a change in the fiscal year from the current September 1 through August 31 to the new dates of July 1 through June 30. In 1994 the fiscal year will be considerably shortened, from September 1, 1993 through June 30, 1994.

Vicki Klutts, assistant director of office services, has indicated that the chapters will now be able to close their yearly records at the end of the academic year. "Additionally, this change of fiscal year will positively affect economies associated with the Society's audit." She urged chapters to make note of this change and incorporate it into their financial reporting.

Additional changes to the Bylaws and Standing Rules have restated the duties of the national officers to reflect their current responsibilities; recognized the role of the Central Office; disbanded the Central Office Development Committee; and established an Editorial Review Committee.

Other items addressed in the changes include clarification of the definition of an undergraduate and a change in the eligibility of transfer students to match that of other students.

Local chapter bylaws will have to be changed to be in conformity with the national Bylaws and Standing Rules. Models of those changes have been mailed to each chapter or are available on diskette in a variety of word processing formats.

Robert L. McCall Honored

A scholarship in the name of Robert L. McCall has been established by the Alpha Iota Chapter, Athens State College, Athens, Alabama to honor the long-time Delta Mu Delta adviser at that school. A \$10,000 check was presented to the Athens State College Foundation for the endowed scholarship fund.

McCall, who retired from the college in May, was professor of marketing and management in the division of business from 1974-92, and became faculty adviser to the Alpha Iota Chapter in 1985. Upon his retirement, he was named professor emeritus and in that capacity will continue to act as an adviser to the chapter. Currently McCall serves as the assistant to the National Vice-president of Extension and Development, Delta Mu Delta.

DMD Participates in Association Conference

Recognizing the diversity and value of collegiate honor societies in the United States, the Association of Collegiate Honor Societies met in Indianapolis, to consider the theme, "Honoring Excellence in the 90's: Many Roads, One Goal."

Speakers included Craig Nelson, professor of Biology and Public and Environmental Affairs, Indiana University-Bloomington who addressed the issue of Critical Thinking and the Roads to Positive Leadership, and Larry Speers, executive director of the Robert K. Greenleaf Center for Servant Leadership who spoke on Servant Leadership and the Honoring of Excellence.

Mildred R. Marion, Executive Secretary, and Vicki Klutts, Assistant Director of Office Services, represented Delta Mu Delta at the meeting.
