EXCELLENCE OF DMD CHAPTER ACTIVITIES

The Anthony J. Jablonsky Award is presented to the chapter that not only exceeds national standards, but has developed outstanding programs to provide creative ways to further chapter growth, development, and visibility. The applicants for the 2006 Jablonsky Award embodied all of these qualities. Each application included well-planned activities and events in recognition of Delta Mu Delta as an honor; recognition of scholastic achievement; community involvement; and campus involvement. Here are highlights from some of the applications.

Alpha Iota Chapter at Athens State University, Alabama, continues its *excellence* by awarding scholarships, Excellence in Teaching awards, and a new Outstanding Alumnus for Delta Mu Delta award. The chapter sponsors an Alabama v. Auburn Canned Food Drive to benefit local shelters and this year sponsored an American Idol contest with proceeds benefiting Hurricane Katrina victims. The college president wore a DMD stole at graduation this past year.

Epsilon Sigma Chapter at the University of the District of Columbia held both fall and spring interest meetings to raise awareness and present the benefits of membership in Delta Mu Delta. The chapter also purchased an ad in the UDC School of Business and Public Administration Annual Scholarship and Awards Dinner program. The faculty adviser and several members of the chapter attended the ACBSP Annual Conference.

Zeta Lambda Chapter at Tarleton State University, Texas, inducted the president of the local Chamber of

Commerce as an honorary member. The Chapter raised money for the local DMD Chapter Scholarship fund which made five awards. Members also helped elderly residents and donated money to help rebuild a foster home which had burned. The Teacher of the Year election and awards luncheon was also sponsored by Tarleton’s DMD chapter.

Eta Sigma Chapter at Methodist University, North Carolina, is the 2006 "Tony" Award winner. Details on page 4.

ETA SIGMA CHAPTER WINS THE "TONY"

The 9th Annual, Anthony J. Jablonsky Outstanding Chapter Award, affectionately known as the "Tony" award, has been presented to the Delta Mu Delta Eta Sigma Chapter at Methodist College (now Methodist University!).

When Methodist's faculty advisor, Pamela Strickland, was told her chapter won the award, she responded "I am proud to be associated with the outstanding students at the Reeves School of Business. Winning the Jablonsky Award would not have been possible without their support and participation in the Eta Sigma Chapter activities. When Eta Sigma submitted the Jablonsky application, I didn't know what the outcome might be – suffice to say, I couldn't be more pleased."

While *excelling* at all the elements considered in awarding the "Tony" Eta Sigma Chapter has been particularly successful in raising the visibility level of Delta Mu Delta on the Methodist University campus in Fayetteville, North Carolina. Appreciably innovative is the Eta Sigma's use of the online course system, BlackBoard, as a communication tool for the chapter. The DMD site can be accessed by members, potential

inductees and alumni. Pictures and reports from recent activities are available on the site. Information about planned events help generate participation in the many activities of the chapter, including the service opportunities offered to the members. Last year the chapter provided assistance to the fundraising efforts for a local animal shelter, selling raffle tickets, as well as helping with set up for and assisting during the benefit. Members partnered with the Accounting Club to provide tax assistance through the Internal Revenue Service's VITA program. Students also helped organize the Operation Christmas Child Program at Methodist University.

Winning the "Tony" entitles the chapter to bring as many as ten students to the 2007 Triennial Meeting free of the registration fee.

The "Tony" award is named to honor Anthony (Tony) Jablonsky for his extraordinary service to Delta Mu Delta first as faculty adviser for 22 years to Eta Chapter, DePaul University, Illinois, beginning more than 40 years ago. For 45 years he and his wife Pat rarely missed an Eta Chapter Induction ceremony. Tony has also served at the national level while faculty adviser, as Chair of Extension and Development, then 14 years as National President and continues to the present on the National Advisory Board and as Chair of the Finance Committee. While National President, he and the Executive Secretary each contributed \$50 to create the Scholarship Fund, which has now grown to over \$423,000. What a legacy to *excellence*! During his tenure, many changes have been made to help insure that Delta Mu Delta continues to be able to provide recognition and support of academic achievement.

FIRST "RICH" RECIPIENT



One of our newest awards recognizes an outstanding faculty adviser for contributions to their Delta Mu Delta chapter. The R. L. Sosnowski Outstanding Faculty Adviser of the Year Award recognizes a single faculty adviser each year for superior stewardship of the adviser's chapter.

Dr. Kathaleena Edward Monds is the winner of the first R. L. Sosnowski Award. Dr. Monds, Assistant Professor at Albany State University, GA, has supported, encouraged and lead ASU's Eta Pi Chapter since 2001.

When asked for her reaction, Kathaleena responded, "This award solidifies the value of service in the academy. All too often, scholarly publications and teaching get the most press. Service is truly the price we pay for our time here on earth. Rich is much admired for his wit, intellect, leadership, and long-standing service to DMD. Receiving the Award puts a great deal of pressure on me to strive for that which Rich has so eloquently laid out as the foundation for success. I hold this honor as a top priority."

Kathaleena was inducted into DMD as an honorary member by Grambling State's Eta Rho Chapter where she served as the founding faculty adviser. She became involved in Eta Pi shortly after arriving as a faculty member at Albany and brought five students to the 2001 Triennial Meeting, where she discovered their chapter needed help. Soon after, she became the faculty adviser and began earnest problem-solving.

In the following academic years of 2001-02 and 2002-03, Eta Pi earned Star Chapter status. Later in 2003 the chapter also won the Anthony J. Jablonsky Outstanding Chapter Award. In addition to all she has done with Eta Pi of Delta Mu Delta, Dr. Monds was equally busy with ACBSP and received their Teaching *Excellence* Award in 2005 for Region 3.

The R. L. Sosnowski Award, nicknamed the "Rich Award" was established in June of 2005 in honor of Rich Sosnowski, a DMD member since 1974, and the current Executive Director of the Society. In 1977 Rich received DePaul University's Eta Chapter Silver Medallion Award as the Outstanding Commerce Student. He then served as president of the Eta Chapter and is still on their board of active members, holding the position of archivist. At the national level he has served as a scholarship judge, as co-chair of the Central Office Development Committee, and was the driving force behind automating the Central Office. Before serving as Executive Director, Rich served as National Treasurer, then Secretary/Treasurer. He currently fills the position of Secretary along with his present duties as Executive Director.



STAR CHAPTERS

The year 2006 represents the ninth year that DMD has recognized Star Chapters. These awards provide recognition to all chapters that meet or exceed national standards for chapter operations and administration. These standards address meetings, induction of new members, officers and reporting activities to central office.

In addition to administrative soundness, recognized chapters show evidence of continued growth and participate in the national scholarship program. The chapter receives a certificate and college officials, including the president of the university, are notified of the recognition the chapter has earned.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM GROWS AGAIN

The first Delta Mu Delta scholarship was presented in 1970, as a single award of \$100. The program for 2006 scholarships aggregate 26 scholarships with a total value of \$28,000. For the first time, this year added the honorable mentions to the program. As many as 21 awards - the size of that first \$100 scholarship - can be made to those applicants who qualify for honorable mention. For 2006, nineteen awards of \$100 were made to students from schools within all regions and throughout the country. ETA PI SPONSORS LECTURE SERIES





She spoke about what graduating students need to be marketable in today's work environment. Emphasis on ethics in the business environment, prompted by the number of ethical meltdowns in that environment, has lead employers to look for individuals who are honest and who have integrity. There is also a need for individuals who can articulate ethical practices for firms, as well as maintaining the expression of ethical guidelines and the enforcement of those guidelines.

Professor Bearden, the Region 3 (Southeastern) Representative on DMD's National Board, serves as Assistant Professor of Business at LaGrange College. She has strong ties to Delta Mu Delta and is the faculty adviser for the Zeta Pi Chapter at LaGrange College where she has been honored for her teaching skills.

ANOTHER GIANT LOST



Dr. James Giffin

With the death of Dr. James Giffin on November 2, 2006, one more significant piece of Delta Mu Delta's history becomes limited to our memory. We would like to gather here some of the most important reminiscences of just what Jim Giffin meant to our Delta Mu Delta Honor Society, so that they will not be lost.

Dr. Giffin taught at Eastern Illinois University's

Business Department beginning in 1947. When the department became the School of Business in 1964, he served as its first Dean until 1974. It was during his time as Dean that Delta Mu Delta installed the Tau Chapter at Eastern Illinois University. While Dean, Dr. Giffin served as the faculty adviser for the chapter for over seven years. In 1980, Jim Giffin was elected as our National President, serving a three-year term.

Dr. Jim Giffin will be most remembered by present and retired board members for his contributions to the evaluation and development of new chapters. Prior to partnering with ACBSP, our Society performed its own assessment as to whether a school's business program met the standards to qualify for a chapter of DMD. For nine years, from the time he retired from teaching in 1983 through 1992, Jim was the accreditation team for the Society. During his last term, as the number of business programs interested in applying for chapters became too large to be handled by one individual, he gained an assistant in Robert McCall.

As our National President, Dr. Giffin developed the procedure which he referred to as "directing the process of negotiations by which a new chapter must come into being." He established criteria to standardize the decision for acceptability of a proposed chapter to assure quality of the program and to avoid any appearance of favoritism. In his twelve years as Vice President of Extension and Development, 80 chapters were added to DMD, near doubling the size.

To this day, his address to the National Chapter on his last day as President is still used to evaluate current circumstances of chapters installed under the older rules. A wonderful obituary was broadcast by Eastern Illinois University on the day after his death - it can be found within this page of our online edition in addition to the local newspaper which created an outstanding story.

Katherine Hinkley

Katherine Anne Hinkley, a senior studying for a double major in management and psychology at Anderson University, Indiana, won our highest award, the Mildred R. Marion Award for \$2,000. Katherine has been extremely active with Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE), and the Flagship Enterprise Center – an energetic small business incubator in Indiana. Her diverse project work with these two organizations included leading a student trip to Mexico to help natives start micro-businesses, and research on how to commercialize alternative energy sources for our economy. Katherine's not-for-profit activities cover Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, and numerous activities through the Eastside Church of God. Her intellectual, physical, and spiritual support for Anderson's community is many multiples of her scholarship.



Rickey Tribble

Rickey Tribble is a non-traditional student at Athens State University, Alabama, and recipient of the Abderrahman Robana Award for \$1,000, he demonstrates the energy and vitality of a different generation to his peers. Rickey returned to full-time university study after almost thirty years as journeyman machinist after gaining an associate's degree at Calhoun Community College. His professors clearly admire Rickey's devotion to family, his commitment to academic *excellence*, and his contributions to the Athen's community. His long-term

leadership of Boy Scouts, his work for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program that assists low-income families with tax preparation, and work for his church – while maintaining an almost perfect GPA – are truly exceptional. Rickey knows that his striving for academic *excellence*, hard work, and perseverance act as an important role model for his family and peers.

Katherine and Rickey's profiles are typical of the scores of scholarship applications that DMD receives each year.
