

Thank you, Riley. My name is Dr Moronke Oke and I am honored to serve as the adviser of the Eta Chi chapter, I'd like to start by sharing the history of the Eta Chi chapter and the benefits of DMD membership with you.

- Delta Mu Delta is an international honor society established to recognize and reward superior scholastic achievement of students in business administration at qualifying accredited colleges and universities.
- Although DMD was founded in 1913, GCU's Eta Chi Chapter was inaugurated until Feb. 23,
 1996 under the leadership of the Dean of the College of Business David Bratten.
- An invitation to join the ETA CHI chapter of Delta Mu Delta confirms that you have a proven **track record of working hard to achieve excellence** in your studies.
- It shows that you have the knowledge and drive to succeed in a business career.





- It also confirms that you have achieved excellence in your studies, ranking in the top 20% of your peers and met faculty approval.
- The goal of DMD is to **create a community** that fosters the well-being of its individual members and the business community through life-time membership.

Mr. lannarelli, in view of your acceptance, we welcome you as an honorary member into the ETA CHI Chapter. Bio here-

I want to take this opportunity to give you some information on Mr. lannarelli's background.

John Iannarelli retired from the FBI after more than 20 years of service, during which time he was a member of the FBI SWAT Team and participated in the investigations of the Oklahoma City Bombing, the 9/11 attack, the shooting of Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords, and the Sony hack.

Among his many FBI assignments, Mr. Iannarelli previously served in Washington, D.C. as the FBI National Spokesperson and later on, as the Executive Staff of the FBI's Cyber Division. He






was a Squad Supervisor before becoming the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the FBI's Phoenix Division, the number two position overseeing all Criminal, Cyber and Counterintelligence investigations throughout Arizona. During his FBI tenure, John was also the recipient of the FBI Director's Distinguished Service Award, for which he was selected from the ranks of the Bureau's 35,000 employees.

A former San Diego Police Officer and a graduate of the University of San Diego School of Law and international studies at Oxford, England, Mr. Iannarelli is an also attorney, admitted to practice law in California, Maryland, and the District of Columbia. In addition, He is the recipient of an Honorary Doctor of Computer Science in recognition of his contributions to the field of cyber investigations.

An engaging and entertaining Certified Speaking Professional [®] who was profiled in Forbes, Mr. Iannarelli is the author of four books, and a frequent on-air contributor for the national news media, to include the Fox News Channel and CNN. He provided live on-scene coverage from Las Vegas of the Mandalay Bay shooting as it occurred. John is now a highly sought-after keynote speaker, known for sharing his intriguing insights combined with his sense of humor.

He has presented to numerous Fortune 500 companies, domestic and international audiences, the United Nations, and the Vatican, where he has personally met on several occasions with Pope Francis.



Induction of new members -

Dr Hammond DMD Overview –

I will now provide you some information about the origin and history of Delta Mu Delta and explain the symbolism of the name and key.

The Delta Mu Delta Honor Society was founded in 1913 by 5 professors from New York University, Harvard University, and Yale University who believed that recognition should be given to outstanding students. The purpose of Delta Mu Delta is twofold:

- To promote higher scholarship in education and
- To recognize and reward scholastic attainment in business subjects.

Although Delta Mu Delta started as a local organization, chapters were later formed at other colleges and universities. In 1952, a national chapter was organized to bind the individual chapters into a





cohesive unit to carry forward the aims of the Society. The number of chapters began to grow slowly from a very few to a dozen or so in the next ten years.

In 1963, Delta Mu Delta was admitted to the Association of College Honor Societies. This association is an organization of 69 International Honor Societies that was formed in 1925 to develop and maintain the standards of honor societies and to increase their usefulness.

In 1992, Delta Mu Delta formed a partnership with ACBSP, the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs. Entrance into our Society is listed among their membership values. Today there are approximately 300 chapters across the United States and abroad.

The academic standards of Delta Mu Delta reflect the achievement of a distinctive order. Our national bylaws permit each chapter to admit to membership students in programs of Business Administration.

At Grand Canyon University, **undergraduate** students and **graduate** students must have an average cumulative grade that is ranked in the top 20% of their respective college classes in cumulative grade average. **Doctoral students** qualify based upon meeting the minimum requirements set forth by Delta Mu Delta and completion of their program. The Eta Chi Chapter at Grand Canyon University has set standards equal to those set forth by our Society's bylaws, and the institution's bylaws have been reviewed and approved on behalf of the DMD Board of Directors.

It is to the Eta Chi Chapter that you are now to be admitted, but your membership is into the Society, wherever established and maintained. This honor can be obtained in only one way. It cannot be bought nor can it be had as a gift. It must be earned by faithful, earnest toil, by serious application to studies, and persistent application in scholastic work.

While Delta Mu Delta is not a social society, we encourage your active interest in the affairs of the chapter and your helpful friendship for every member.

The name Delta Mu Delta stands for the Greek phrase – DIA MATHESEOS DYNAMIS – which translated, signifies – THROUGH KNOWLEDGE, POWER – not the power of uncontrolled aggression, but the power to manage for social and economic good. Use the knowledge that you gain in extending the power of right and truth. Knowledge is not selfish or self-seeking, and the true student will seek and obtain knowledge for the greater purpose of helping others through service and transmission of things learned. The badge of the Society is the key, symbolizing the key which unlocks the treasure house of the universe. It is in the form of the Greek letter Delta (point to the key on the banner). On the front of the key appear the Greek initials of the Society and above them is a full-rigged ship with sails set and colors flying, symbolizing the activities of the business –not as a mercenary vocation, but as a bond which unites and blesses all mankind.

The key and certificate are the tangible and visible evidence of the honor which you have attained. They should be two of your most cherished possessions, ones you will wear and display proudly. Your success in college has brought you this recognition. We expect you, as members of Delta Mu Delta, to add new luster to our school, your community, your profession, and to the Society.






